Jack Welch, Jeff Beers and Jim Finnegan were hard at work in preparation for opening their doors on Washington Street before the momentous turn of the century.

The Frog Restaurant & Bar found its home between the Morris County Court House and the historic Morristown Green in November of 1999. From the outset, this family friendly restaurant steadily drew in the crowds from Morristown and the surrounding communities with its full service bar and consistently good food. The restaurant uses the same burger blend from the day they opened and prides itself on its signature chicken fingers
